Community Resource Inventory (CRI)

Public school staff members are an on-going support for students with disabilities and their families from the time they enter public school until they meet graduation requirements and graduate or age-out of special education services. Students who are eligible for special education services under IDEA are entitled to the services. In public school, educators are responsible for identifying students with disabilities and taking steps to help parents access the eligibility process. There are no entitlements after public school, and adults with disabilities must seek information and services on their own. No one will conduct an "adult find" similar to the public school "Child Find."

To access services, adults with disabilities and their families must know what resources are available in the community and how to access the services. For needs with no known services, the adult with a disability and/or their family must know how to seek information to connect them with needed services. The "Community Assessment" survey was initially developed by D. A. Neubert and M.S. Moon from the University of Maryland in Baltimore. The following Community Resource Inventory (CRI) was adapted from Drs. Neubert and Moon's Community Assessment survey. Information from the CRI will assist students, staff, and parents in identifying community resources and supports that support the student's postsecondary goals.
